

SUMMER CAMPS ★★★★★ FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS

Summertime is almost here, and if your middle school student (Grades 6-8 for fall 2003) is not attending summer school, he/she may be eligible to register for a **free** middle school summer camp.

Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis with 110 campers allowed per camp. The student to teacher ratio will be 37 to 1.

SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAMS FOR 2003

Grade 3 Summer Services

Intensive supplemental reading instruction will be provided to the following third grade students: Current third grade students who score Level 1 on the reading portion of the 2003 FCAT and are being retained; current second grade students who are promoted to the third grade for the 2003-04 school year but scored at or below the 25th percentile on the second grade Stanford Achievement Test, Ninth Edition, administered in March 2003; and Limited English Proficient (LEP) students and Exceptional Student Education (ESE) students who meet the above eligibility criteria. The third grade summer reading camp will be held for 15 half days beginning July 7, 2003.

Grade 8 Summer Services

Grade 8 students who need to make up one or two courses in order to be promoted to the ninth grade will be eligible to attend the summer program. Limited English Proficient (LEP) students and Exceptional Student Education (ESE) students who meet the above eligibility criteria also will be in attendance. The grade 8 summer program will be 20 days beginning July 7, 2003. Students that need only one course will attend half the day.

Grade 10, 11 and 12 Summer Services

Academic instructional services will be provided for 20 days for students in grades 10, 11 and 12 who meet the following eligibility criteria:

Grade 10

Students that did not pass the reading and/or mathematics portion of the grade 10 FCAT. If the student failed both, the student will enroll in a reading course. Tenth grade students will enroll in one course for the 20 days and receive .5 credit. Limited English Proficient (LEP) students and Exceptional Student Education (ESE) students who meet the above eligibility criteria also will be in attendance.

Grades 11 and 12

Current 11th graders that need to make up a maximum of 1 credit in order to be eligible for grade 12. Students that fail a 12th grade course. Students, in grade 12 only, who have not passed the FCAT for graduation. Students, in grade 12 only, who need a course for forgiveness in order to improve their GPA to the minimum 2.0 required for graduation. Students who have not received a passing score in reading or mathematics on the FCAT. Limited English proficient (LEP and Exceptional Student Education (ESE) students who meet the above eligibility criteria also will be in attendance.

Adult Education Summer Services

Students who need to seek grade forgiveness or improve the GPA above the minimum 2.0 required for graduation will be allowed to enroll in a maximum of two credits through the adult education program. These students will follow the adult education schedule.

Academic Acceleration

Rising 10th, 11th and 12th grade students, who meet minimum requirements, as stipulated by state statute and the individual colleges and universities, may enroll in dual enrollment courses during the summer. Dual enrollment courses require the college or university to waive tuition and the district to fund the cost of the textbooks. Students are responsible for their own transportation.
