Mr. Nicholas Negroponte, a professor at MIT, has originated a promising concept: a laptop computer for every child. He developed a prototype computer tested by school children in under-developed countries. He worked with Google and other large companies to develop a low-cost, child-friendly laptop computer that is workable and can be used under a variety of conditions and which costs under \$200. His initiative, One Laptop Per Child, is working with countries worldwide to generate sufficient orders for mass production.

Intel Corporation has joined Mr. Negroponte in this endeavor which has the potential to revolutionize education.

It would be beneficial if Miami-Dade County Public Schools explored this idea with *One Laptop Per Child* and Intel Corporation.
